PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS:

- Print only the first page with 1x1 inch and/ or 2x2 cm blocks on the first page
- Set printer to 100% scale
- Avoid "Print Entire Image" or "Fill Entire Paper" options, as this will make your pattern print at the wrong size
- Measure printed 1x1 inch & 2x2 cm blocks with a ruler for accuracy
- If sizing is correct, print all pages at 100% scale
- Assemble and cut out the pattern

SUPPLIES & TOOLS:

The items listed are conveniently hyperlinked to their respective pages on the Fabric8 website, if available. Simply click on the desired item, and it will effortlessly open up in your web browser for easy access and purchase.

Fabric:

- 1m x 140cm outer fabric
- 1m x 140cm inner fabric

Supplies:

- 4 x 25cm dress zips
- ½ meter of 25mm bias tape
- 1m fusing

Tools:

- <u>Sewing machine bobbins</u>
- Fabric scissors
- Fabric marker/ tailors chalk
- Pins
- Fabric clips
- Prym mini steam iron
- Table sized ironing board
- Rotary cutter
- Self-healing cutting mat
- Quilting ruler
- Paper scissors
- Paper glue

1. PREPARING THE MATERIALS

- Cut 2 x Bag Outside Fabric + Fusing
- Cut 2 x Bag Inside Fabric + Fusing
- Cut 4 x Inside Zip Pocket Outer Fabric
- Cut 4 x Inside Zip Pocket Lining Fabric
- Cut 1 x Bag Handle Outside Fabric + Fusing
- Cut 1 x Zip Tabs Outside Fabric
- Cut 2 x Zip Bag Sides Outside Fabric
- Cut 2 x Zip Bag Sides Inside Fabric
- Cut 9 x 17.5cm Hook & Loop (Velcro) 20mm wide

Note: For all pieces that require fusing, cut the fusing 1cm smaller on all sides. For the Bag handle, only trim away 1cm on each of the short sides. Iron the fusing to the wrong side of all pieces.

2. PREPARING OUTSIDE BAG PIECES


• Outside Bag Outer Fabric:

• Lay the Bag Outside Outer Fabric Piece right side up on the table.

- Transfer all pattern markings onto your piece.
- Using the markings, pin all Velcro Loop pieces to the right side of the fabric.
- Sew a square around the Velcro Loop Pieces to secure them.


• Outside Bag Inner Fabric:

- Lay the Bag Outside Outer Fabric Piece right side up on the table.
- Transfer all pattern markings onto your piece.
- Using the markings, pin the Velcro Hook piece to the right side of the fabric.
- Sew a square around the Velcro Hook Piece to secure it.



3. INNER ZIP POCKET SIDES PREPARATION


- Place one outside fabric and one lining fabric (Square) with wrong sides together, aligning the raw edges.
- Draw a line from one corner to the opposite corner and repeat for the other corner, creating an X in the middle of the square.
- Cut along the lines just drawn, resulting in 4 double fabric triangles.
- For easier sewing later, baste these triangles together close to the raw edge.
- Repeat the above steps until you have 8 x Double layer triangles.



4. BAG HANDLE AND ZIP TABS PREPARATION

Bag Handle:

- Mark the Bag Handle piece down its center lengthwise and then again in the middle of each side using the pattern piece for reference.
- Fold the seam allowance on the short sides of the Handle Piece to the wrong side and iron.
- Fold each of the long sides in, aligning the raw edges with your center line lengthwise, and iron.
- Fold along the center line to create a sturdy bag handle. Topstitch close to the two long edges to finish.




• Zip Tabs:


- Mark the Zip Tab piece down its center lengthwise and then again in the middle of each side using the pattern piece for reference.
- Fold the seam allowance on the short sides of the Handle Piece to the wrong side and iron.
- Fold each of the long sides in, aligning the raw edges with your center line lengthwise, and iron.
- Fold along the center line to create a sturdy bag handle. Topstitch close to the two long edges to finish.
- Cut 8 x 5cm Tabs, fold them in half, and baste the raw edges of each tab to keep them together.



5. CONSTRUCTING INNER ZIP POCKET PIECES

• Lay all 4 Inner Zip Pocket Outside Fabric Pieces face up on the table.






- Transfer all pattern markings onto your piece.
- Using the markings, pin all Velcro Hook pieces to the right side of the fabric.
- Sew a square around the Velcro Loop Pieces to secure them.

6. SEWING ZIP INTO POCKETS

- Lay the Outside Zip Pocket piece right side up on the table. Place the Zip right side down, aligning it with the raw edge of the fabric.
- Place the Zip Pocket Lining piece right side down and sandwich the zip between the two fabrics. Sew at 1cm.





- Turn over and topstitch approximately 5mm from the zip edge.
- Pin the pieces neatly together and transfer the pattern markings onto both the outer and lining sides.






• Sew the other side of the zip starting on the outer fabric side. Turn up the raw edge and match the right side to the right side of the zip. Repeat with the lining side to again sandwich the zip between two fabric layers. Sew at 1cm, open the zip, and turn over the pocket with the right side out. Topstitch 5mm away from the zip edge.



• Using the previous markings, fold the fabric as shown in the provided picture.



7. SEWING ZIP POCKET SIDES


• Using your prepared triangles, mark all around 1cm with a fabric marker.



• Using 2 triangles for each pocket, align the markings as shown in the provided picture and sew only between the markings.



• While pinning, insert two of the Zip tabs as shown in the provided picture, covering the Zip with raw edges aligned on the outside.



- Sew the other two seams from mark to mark using the same method as above.
- Finish by overlocking the edge or applying bias binding to the raw edges for a neat finish.
- Repeat for all 4 Pockets and turn them right side out.

8. SEWING OUTSIDE BAG PIECES

- Lay the Bag Outside Outer Fabric Piece wrong side up on the table.
- Place the Bag Outside Inner Fabric Piece onto the Outer fabric piece right side up, so the two pieces are wrong sides together.
- Baste them together 5mm from the edge.
- At the corners, cut and round them neatly.
- Apply Bias binding all around the edge.
- Pin the Handle in place as indicated on the pattern and sew through all layers (for added strength) to attach the handle.
- Attach all 4 inner pockets using the hook and loop. Fold/roll up the bag, and you are done!

PRINTING INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Start by only printing this page with the measurement scale (as below).
- 2. Ensure that your printer settings are correct:
 - Set your printer to "Do not scale" or to "100% scale". Set to A4.
 - Make sure that you have <u>not</u> selected "Print entire image" or "Fill entire paper". This will make your sizing incorrect.
 - You have to print your pattern at 100% scale.
- 3. Using a ruler or measuring tape, measure the inches or centimeters on the measurement scale below once this page has been printed out. Ensure that the measurement scale lines up with your ruler or measuring tape. If it does, it means you have selected the correct printer settings.
- 4. If your measurement scale lines up correctly, print out the rest of the pattern pages at 100% scale.
- 5. Cut out and line up the lines of the pattern pages. Ensure that the triangles in the corner all line up. Stick your pattern together as illustrated below.


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
